



2026 Important Information for Property Owners

Dear Collingwood Residents and Property Owners,

We're pleased to share with you that the Town continues to plan and manage its finances through a programs and service-based budgeting approach allowing us to carefully allocate resources to the 8 program areas and 151 services and subservices that matter most to our community.

Tax Dollar Breakdown

Property taxes are calculated by applying the municipal tax rate to the property's assessed value as determined by MPAC. Based on a sample home assessed at \$327,000, which represents the MPAC value assigned to a median home in Collingwood, the total taxes payable will be \$4,155 broken down as follows: **Town Portion \$2,605**, County Portion \$1,050 and Education Portion \$500.

When you think about where your tax dollars go, it's important to know you're getting real value in return – and you are! The Town Portion of your property tax bill is used to deliver the many services that residents, businesses, and visitors rely on from the Town. Some examples include **Roads and Active Transportation** – providing safe routes for everyone to travel through Town, whether driving, cycling, or other method, and crossing guards to ensure children get to school safely; **Fire & Rescue** – providing fire suppression, training and rescue, tiered medical response, and Marine rescue/firefighting 24/7/365; **Police** – to maintain public safety and enforce laws; **Parks & Harbour** – providing the management of park greenspaces, trails, parking lots, urban forest, hazardous and invasive plant control, marina, yacht club, and harbour; **Community Culture, Arts & Recreation Spaces** – providing recreation, arts and culture facilities, and so much more!

Tax Reductions

Pending tax reductions from Assessment Appeals, Requests for Reconsideration, Special Amended Notices, or Section 357, reductions will be processed after the final tax bill.

Pre-Authorized Payment Plans

Your 2026 final property tax bill is enclosed. The total amount is payable in two installments, due on August 21 and October 16, 2026.





Change of Address or New Owner

The Town will issue tax bills to the mailing address provided by your solicitor, or to the address indicated on the transfer deed. If a mailing address has not been specified, the tax bill will be sent to the property address by default. If you wish to change your mailing address, you must notify the Treasury Department in writing, or by email at taxes@collingwood.ca

Penalties and Interest

To avoid penalty and interest charges, payment must be received by the Treasury Department on or before the due date. Interest will be added at the rate of 1.25% on the first day of each month for as long as the account is outstanding.
