Pin Cherry	<i>Prunus pensylvanica</i>	<b>Remember when choosing a location for the tree</b>
Sand Cherry	<i>Prunus pumila</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keep at least 5' away from fences, walkways, decks, buildings</li> <li>• Regularly water the tree during its first year</li> </ul>
