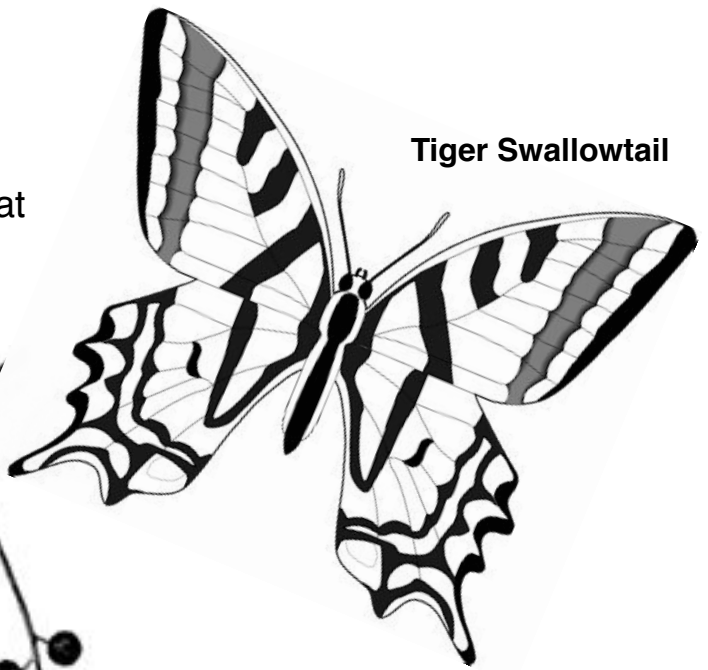


Native Plants of Ontario provide habitat for butterflies, bees and other pollinators.

Tiger Swallowtail

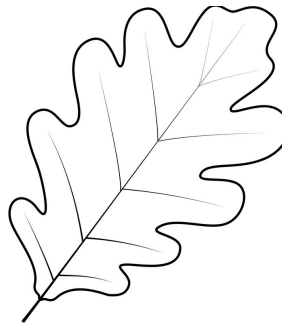


Black Cherry

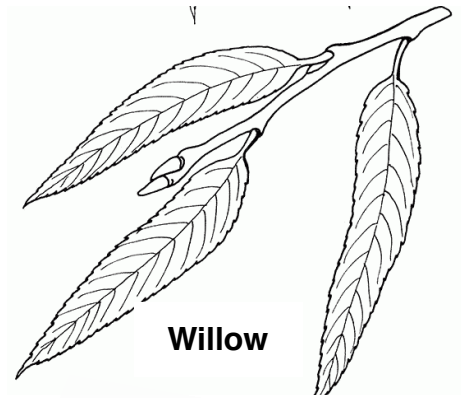

White Oak

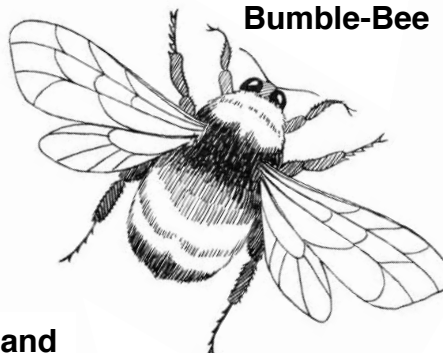
