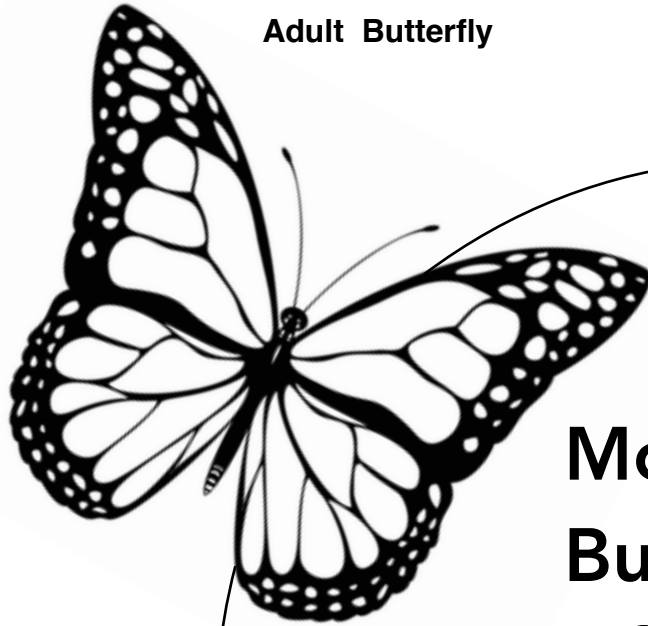


Adult Butterfly

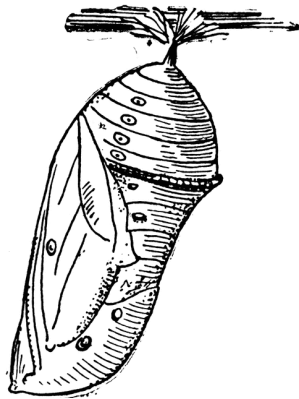


**Lays eggs on
milkweed**



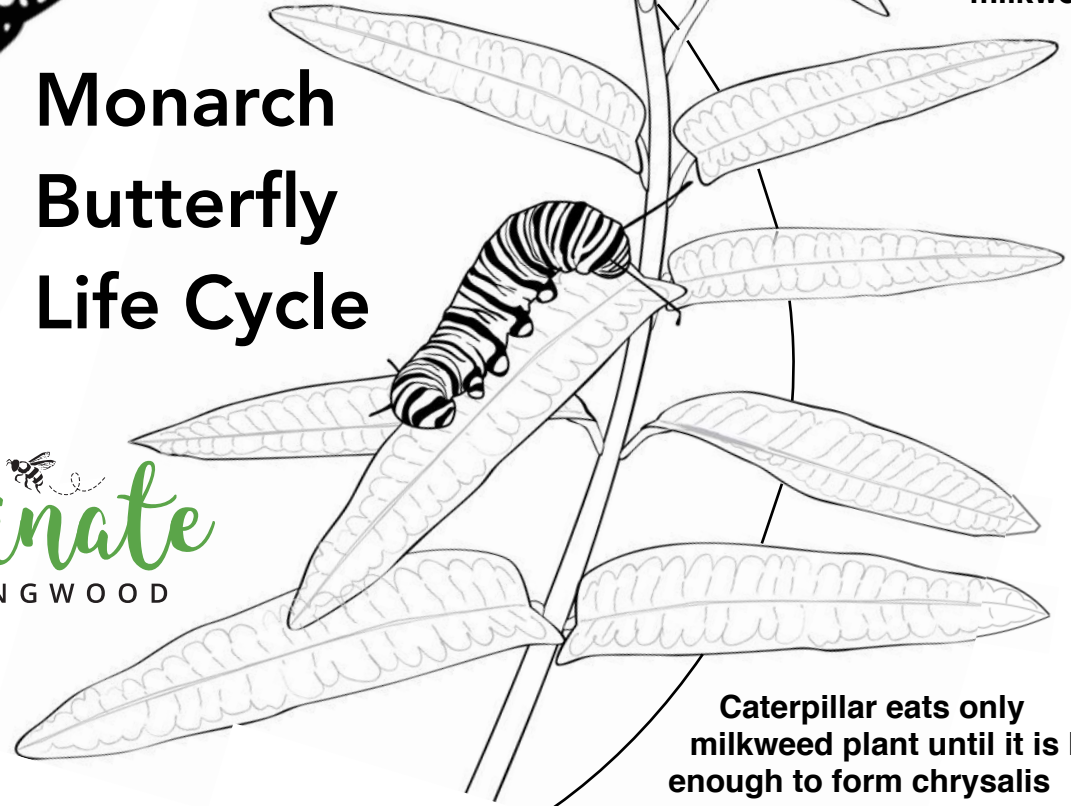
Monarch Butterfly Life Cycle

Did you know?

The Monarch Butterfly makes the longest migration of any insect in North America. In autumn they will fly from Ontario to Mexico, some 4800km, where they overwinter. As the days grow longer again, they begin to move back north, stopping somewhere along the route to lay eggs, form a chrysalis, then emerge as another Monarch. This process may repeat four or five generations before the monarchs have reached Canada again.
