Harbourview Park - Labyrinth

Explore the Labyrinth at Harbourview Park place to pause and reflect. What animal has a strong connection to this area?

Harbourview Park - Trail

Search the trail that runs through Harbourview Park, the section of the trail that passes through the forest, just past the Labyrinth contains a tree with the words Hug Me - what type of tree is this?

Harbourview - Awen' Gathering Place

Collingwood stands on the lands of the Anishinaabe peoples who gathered foods, medicines and materials from the forest in this area. The Awen' Gathering Place links the layers of the food forest to the Grandfather Teachings, a group of teachings that guide 'the good way of life'. How many teachings are there?

Collingwood Museum

Visit the Collingwood Museum and take a peak through the windows. Find this week's scavenger hunt picture. What organization did the women in the photo volunteer for?

Collingwood Friendship Garden

The Friendship Gardens in Collingwood are a hidden gem, a beautiful place for a relaxing stroll or meditation. What are two features of the garden that highlight the relationship with Japan?

Collingwood Town Hall

Kindness can be shown in the act of giving. Visit Collingwood Town Hall. In 1950 the Tower Clock and Striking Bell were donated by an employee of the Collingwood Shipyards Ltd. What was their job at the shipyards?
