

Snorkel Mask

Did you know there are shipwrecks in Georgian Bay? You can even watch a video of the Mary Ward shipwreck on YouTube (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rVGTT7S-V0>). Make a snorkel mask to immerse yourself in the underwater world of historic shipwrecks.

Remember to use safety scissors when cutting or ask for help from an adult.

What you need:

- Paper plate
- Snorkel mask template (page 2)
- White paper or cardstock
- Markers or pencil crayons
- Scissors
- Glue



How to make your snorkel mask:

1. Cut out the center of the paper plate so that only the outside ring is left.
2. Print out the snorkel mask template on to white paper or cardstock.
3. Decorate snorkel mask using markers or pencil crayons.
4. Cut snorkel mask out of the template. (*You may need to wait for marker to dry.*)
5. Glue template pieces to the outer ring of the paper plate.
