CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF COLLINGWOOD

BY-LAW NO. 2710

A BY-LAW OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF COLLINGWOOD TO REGULATE BICYCLES

WHEREAS by Section 377, Subsection 54 of The Municipal Act R.S.O. 1960, Chapter 249 as amended, it is provided that by-laws may be passed by the Council of a municipality for prohibiting vehicles on sidewalks etc. as the Council may deem necessary.

AND WHEREAS by Section 482, Subsection 1 of The Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1960, Chapter 249 as amended, it is provided that by-laws may be passed for imposing fines of not more than \$300.00 exclusive of costs upon every person who contravenes any by-law of the Council passed under the authority of this Act.

AND WHEREAS it is considered desirable and expedient to pass a by-law in the Town of Collingwood pursuant to such provisions.

THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF COLLING-WOOD ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- This by-law may be cited as The Bicycle By-law.
- 2. No person shall ride a bicycle or any other vehicle along or upon any sidewalk, pathway or foot path used or set apart for the use of pedestrians and forming part of any highway or bridge, boulevard, park, parklot, garden or other place set apart for ornament or embellishment or for public recreation within the limits of the Town of Collingwood.
- 3. No person shall, on any public highway, within the limits of the Town of Collingwood, while riding a bicycle designed to carry one person only, carrying another person on such vehicle or carrying any kind of goods thereon in such a position or manner to prevent or interfere with the rider having full control of such bicycle.
- 4. No person shall leave a bicycle lying on any public sidewalk or park or place the same, against any window or in front of or across a door or step or entraceway to any store or other building so as to obstruct or interfere with the ingress to and egress from such door or building.
- 5. Any person contravening the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable upon summary conviction for a first offence to a minimum fine of \$5.00 exclusive of costs and for a second and subsequent offence to a minimum fine of \$10.00 exclusive of costs but not to exceed \$300.00.

READ a first and second time, considered in the Committee of the Whole, read a third time and finally passed this 9th day of November, 1970.
