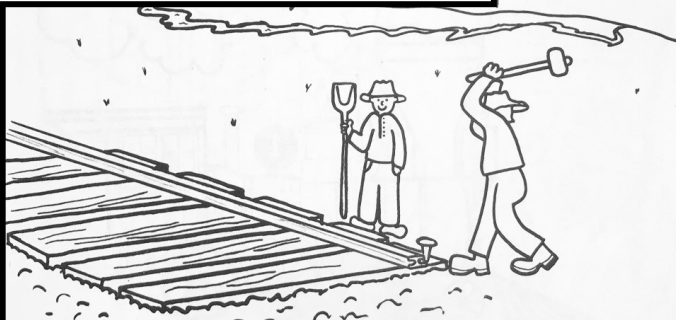
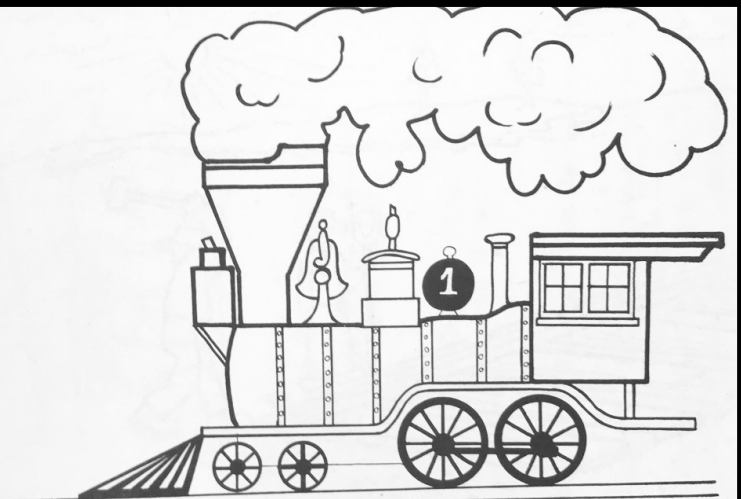


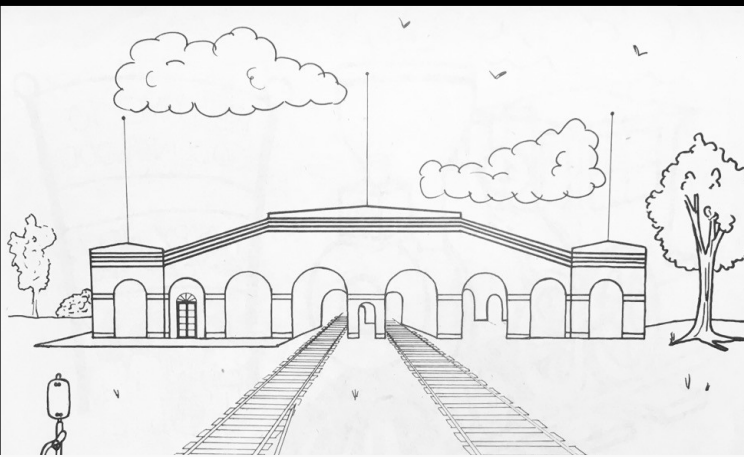
Before the Collingwood Museum, there was a train station...



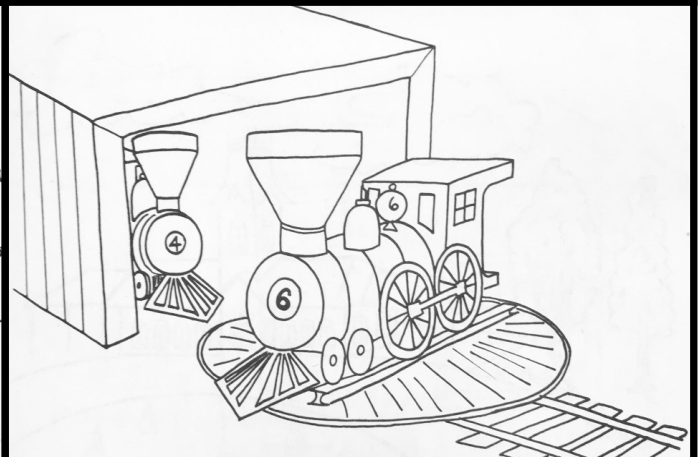
In 1851, men began to build the railway tracks from Toronto to Collingwood.
